# Registration

# **Billing and Financial Aid**

- A non-refundable deposit of 25% of the full cost of summer camps registered for is required to reserve your camper's place. For current FSMN families, you will receive an invoice through FACTs to complete registration. For families who do not currently attend FSMN, you will be billed through FSMN's PayPal and can pay with a credit card. Please contact the business office for additional information (bookkeeper@fsmn.org).
- The remainder of your balance will be invoiced through FACTs or billed through PayPal no later than May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- A non-refundable \$25 Registration Fee per camper is required for registration. This fee will be waived for current FSMN students.
- For those receiving financial aid from FSMN, FSMN is able to offer your current tuition aid rate less 25%. For additional information or questions regarding aid, please contact bookkeeper@fsmn.org.
- The Office of Higher Education Summer Enrichment Stipend may be available for families who receive tuition aid from FSMN or who qualify for Free and Reduced Price Lunch. If you qualify for the OHE Summer Enrichment Stipend, you will receive a form to apply for up to \$1,000 towards your remaining summer camp fees. When/if available, FSMN will require eligible families to apply for this stipend prior to FSMN's aid being applied. Please note, that state funding for this program has not yet been finalized.
- A full refund, minus the non-refundable deposit, will be given to those who cancel their camp sessions prior to May 1<sup>st</sup>. To ensure staffing and programmatic commitments to all families, no refunds will be issued after May 1<sup>st</sup>. This policy includes cancellations due to vacations, conflicting activities, and/or changes in family plans.
- If a camp is canceled due to inclement weather, low attendance, or lack of staffing by FSMN, a full refund will be given to those registered.

# **Important Information**

- FSMN will not be offering a hot lunch option during Summer Camp. All information and guidelines regarding lunch and snacks will be communicated by your camp(s) leader(s) prior to the start of camp.
- FSMN will not be offering before or aftercare. All campers must be dropped off and picked up at their camp's designated time.
- Absences, Late Arrival, Early Pick-Up: All absences, late arrivals, and early pick-ups
  must be reported to the camp lead and camp director as early as possible. In cases of
  late arrivals and early pick-up, the camp lead and camp director will attempt to
  accommodate these situations; however, due to logistical reasons, these situations may

- not be feasible and require a camper to miss that day. There will be no refunds for student absences due to illness, appointments, or changes in schedules.
- Weather: If weather affects the ability of a camp or camps to operate, camp staff will
  contact families as soon as possible. Camp activities may be adjusted to accommodate
  inclement weather.
- To ensure the safety, well-being, and enjoyment of all, campers participating in Summer Camps at FSMN will follow the behavior expectations set forth in FSMN's Family Handbook. Each camper must:
  - Respect themselves. Respect others. Respect their surroundings.
  - Use words to solve problems.
  - o Take responsibility for themselves and their actions.
  - Follow all directions and rules from adults at camp.

Parents/guardians of campers who are unable or unwilling to follow these expectations will be asked to pick up their camper(s). In some cases, the camper may not be able to return for the remainder of the camp. No refund will be given.
